New SIAG on Data Mining and Analytics

SIAM's newest activity group, the [SIAG on Data Mining and Analytics](#) was approved by Board and Council at ICIAM 2011. The objectives of the group are to advance the mathematics of data mining by highlighting its applications and exploring connections between data mining and other applied sciences. With a focus on design, analysis and implementation of data mining algorithms and systems, the group will involve researchers in the areas of computing machinery, and electrical and electronics engineering. The SIAG will closely integrate its activities with the international SIAM Conference on Data Mining (SDM), in addition to sponsoring minisymposia at other SIAM conferences.

Registration open for Moody's Mega Math (M³) Challenge

Registration is now open for the 2012 M³ Challenge, organized by SIAM in partnership with The Moody's Foundation. An Internet-based math-modeling competition for high school students, the contest is designed to motivate students toward viable and exciting career choices in the areas of applied math, economics and finance. To that end, past years of the contest have tackled such timely issues as options for energy independence and the impact of declining water resources, thus allowing young students a chance to weigh in on genuine problems faced by the world today. The contest is **free** and currently open to high schools in 29 states in the Eastern United States. Working in teams of three to five, participants must solve an open-ended, math-modeling problem focused on a realistic issue in 14 hours. Scholarships totaling \$115,000 toward the pursuit of higher education will be awarded to the top teams in April. Challenge weekend is set for **March 3–4, 2012**. DOE's Science Graduate Fellowship Program

The Department of Energy has announced the Office of Science Graduate Fellowship (SCGF) Program, a three-year award providing partial tuition support, an annual stipend, and a research allowance for full-time graduate study and thesis/dissertation research at U.S. academic institutions. Applicants must be U.S. citizens and first- or second-year graduate students or undergraduate seniors pursuing or planning to pursue advanced degrees in areas relevant to the Office of Science research at the time of application. Relevant areas include physics, materials sciences, chemistry, biology, applied mathematics, computer and computational sciences, environmental sciences, and some areas of engineering. AWM Workshop at SIAM AN12

A workshop by the Association for Women in Mathematics (AWM) will take place July 9–10 in conjunction with the [2012 SIAM Annual Meeting](#) in Minneapolis, MN. The workshop will consist of a graduate student poster session, presentations by recent Ph.D.s, a mentoring event, and a career minisymposium. Workshop participants will have the opportunity to meet with other women mathematicians in different stages of their careers. AWM urges female graduate students who have made substantial progress toward their thesis topics to submit posters; up to 10 applicants will be selected to present their posters at the graduate student poster session. Women who have completed their Ph.D.s within the past five years may apply to present research talks in two minisymposia, one of which will focus on mathematical biology, and the other is open to applicants from all applied areas. Up to four women will be selected to give a talk in each minisymposium.

The application deadline is Friday, November 18, 2011.
