SIAM has an active Committee on Science Policy (CSP) that meets twice a year in Washington, DC. The SIAM Council and Board recently elevated the position of Chair of the CSP to that of Vice President for Science Policy. The SIAM President, with the concurrence of both the SIAM Council and the SIAM Board of Trustees, has appointed Reinhard Laubenbacher Vice President for Science Policy. He will begin

serving a two-year term on January 1. One of Laubenbachers's initiatives is to involve interested SIAM members in various aspects of science policy, beginning with email notifications.
